

Pupil Premium 2015-2016 St Michael and All Angels CE Primary School

Report from Neil Bardsley (Head Teacher) on the allocation and spending of Pupil Premium Funding 2015-2016.

Reporting requirements for schools receiving the Pupil Premium;

The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most.

The general requirement for schools to publish online details of their Pupil Premium allocation, spend and impact, includes funding provided in respect of children of armed forces personnel, known as the Service Premium.

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However they will be held accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families. New measures have been included in the performance tables that capture the achievement of those disadvantaged pupils covered by the Pupil Premium. The Government also requires schools to publish online details of how they have used the premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the premium.

The Report from 2015-2016

In 2015-2016, Pupil Premium funding was set at £1320 per pupil. The allocation for the school was £8140

PROVISION

The ways in which the funding was used in 2015-2016 included:

- Funding of a Teaching Assistant who will work one to one/small group with children for 4hours per week .
- Financial support towards school trips.
- Resources to support the children's learning.

- Continuation of homework club.
- Educational Psychologist.
- Out of school resources to support families with extra-curricular activities.
- Intervention programmes for underachieving pupils and those with special educational needs.
- Training/CPD for staff.

OUTCOMES

Key Stage 1 and 2 July 2016 Outcomes (note only very small number of children) :

Reading: 80% working at age related expectations or higher with 80% making expected or better progress.

Writing: 40% working at age related expectations or higher with 100% making expected or better progress.

Maths: 80% working at age related expectations or higher with 80% making expected or better progress.

Plans 2016-2017

In 2016-2017, Pupil Premium funding is, at present, set at £1320 per pupil. The allocation for the school is forecast at £6050.

The funding will be used for:

- Funding of a Teaching Assistant who will work one to one/small group with children for 4 hours per week targeting attainment in Writing.
- Funding of an additional Teaching Assistant who will work one to one/small group with children for 3 ½ hours per week.
- Financial support towards school trips.
- Resources to support the children's learning.
- Continuation of homework club.
- Educational Psychologist.
- Out of school resources to support families with extra-curricular activities.
- Intervention programmes for underachieving pupils and those with special educational needs.
- Training/CPD for staff.
