Report from Neil Bardsley (Head teacher) on the allocation and spending of Pupils Premium funding 2016-2017.

#### Reporting requirements for schools receiving the Pupil Premium

*The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities to reach their potential, and to support children and young people with parents in the regular armed forces.*

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However they will be held accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families. New measures have been included in the performance tables that capture the achievement of those disadvantaged pupils covered by the Pupil Premium. The Government also requires schools to publish online details of how they have used the premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the premium.

Pupil Premium funding entitlement for schools is recalculated each January and awarded to the school for the period 1 April – 31 March following.

St Michael & All Angels Funding Agreement requires that the following information is published each financial year

- The amount of Pupil Premium allocation that we will receive during the Academy Financial Year
- On what we intend to spend the allocation
- On what we have spent the Pupil Premium allocation in the previous Academy Financial Year
- The impact in educational attainment arising from expenditure of the previous Academic Financial Year Pupil Premium.

Pupil Premium report from 2016-2017

In 2016-2017, pupil premium funding was set at £1320 per pupil. The allocation for the school was £6050.

#### PROVISION

The ways in which the funding was used in 2016-2017 included:

- Funding of a Teaching Assistant who will work one to one/small groups with children for 4 hours per week.

- Small, targeted group work (Year 5/6) with learning support assistant. 3 mornings per week
- Financial support towards school trips.
- Resources to support the children's learning.
- Weekly after-school homework club led by a teaching assistant
- Outside agency support
- Intervention programmes for underachieving pupils and those with special educational needs.
- Training/CPD for staff

## OUTCOMES

- Improved attendance
- Accelerated progress in reading, writing and maths
- Increased confidence and well-being

Pupil Premium Plans 2017 -2018
--------------------------------

In 2017-2018, pupil premium funding is, at present, set at £1320 per pupil. Pupil Premium Plus funding is set at £1900 per pupil. The allocation for the school is forecast at £6630.

The funding will be used for:

- Funding of a Teaching Assistant who will work one to one/small group with children for 4 hours per week. This will include an EEF endorsed intervention known as Catch Up Literacy and Catch Up Numeracy.
- Funding of a Learning Support Assistant for 8 hours a week for one to one and group support.
- Financial support towards school trips.
- Resources to support the children's learning.
- Continuation of homework club
- Out of school resources to support families with extra-curricular activities.
- Intervention programmes for underachieving pupils and those with special educational needs.
- Training/CPD for staff
