

## Pupil Premium 2017-2018

St. Michael and All Angels CE Primary School

Report from Neil Bardsley (Head Teacher) on the allocation and spending of Pupils Premium funding 2017-2018.

Reporting requirements for schools receiving the Pupil Premium.

*The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most.*

The general requirement for schools to publish online details of their Pupil Premium allocation, spend and impact, includes funding provided in respect of children of armed forces personnel, known as the Service Premium.

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However, they will be held accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families. New measures have been included in the performance tables that capture the achievement of those disadvantaged pupils covered by the Pupil Premium. The Government also requires schools to publish online details of how they have used the premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium.

## Pupil Premium Report from 2017-2018

In 2017-2018, pupil premium funding was set at £1320 per pupil. The allocation for the school was £ 5280.

### PROVISION

The ways in which the funding was used in 2017-2018 included:

- Funding of a Teaching Assistant who worked one to one/small group with children for 4 hours per week. This included an EEF endorsed intervention known as Catch Up Literacy and Catch Up Numeracy.

- Funding of a Learning Support Assistant for 8 hours a week for one to one and group support.
- Financial support towards school trips.
- Resources to support the children's learning.
- Continuation of homework club.
- Out of school resources to support families with extra-curricular activities.
- Intervention programmes for underachieving pupils and those with special educational needs.
- Training/CPD for staff.

### OUTCOMES

- Improved attendance.
- Accelerated progress and attainment in reading, writing and maths.
- Increased confidence and well-being.

### Pupil Premium Plans 2018-2019

In 2018-2019, Pupil Premium Funding is, at present, set at £1320 per pupil.

How we will use our Pupil Premium spending;

- Funding of a Learning Support Assistant for 8 hours a week for one to one and group support.
- Funding of a Teaching Assistant who will work one to one/small group with children for 4hours per week.
- Homework club.
- Financial support for trips/residentials.
- Educational Psychologist.
- Resources to support the children's learning.
- Training/CPD for staff.
