Report from Neil Bardsley (Head teacher) on the allocation and spending of Pupil Premium funding 2019-2020.

Reporting requirements for schools receiving the Pupil Premium

The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most.

The general requirement for schools to publish online details of their Pupil Premium allocation, spend and impact, includes funding provided in respect of children of armed forces personnel, known as the Service Premium.

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However they will be held accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families. New measures have been included in the performance tables that capture the achievement of those disadvantaged pupils covered by the Pupil Premium. The Government also requires schools to publish online details of how they have used the premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the premium.

Pupil Premium report from 2019-2020

In 2019-2020, pupil premium funding was set at £1320 per pupil. The allocation for the school was £8202 which included a supplementary FSM provision grant

PROVISION

The ways in which the funding was used in 2019-2020 included:

- Funding of a Teaching Assistant who worked with one to one/small groups for 4 hours per week.

- Funding of a Learning Support Assistant for 4.75 hours a week for one to one and group support, including support
- Financial support towards school trips.
- Provision of free school meals
- Financial support towards out of school sporting activities
- External support including time with external SENco
- Resources to support the children throughout lockdown March - July

It should be noted that due to Covid-19 some of the funding has been carried over to 2020-2021

OUTCOMES

- Increased confidence and well-being
- Ability to attend school trips
- Increased cultural capital
- Ability to swim more confidently and support physical need

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| Pupil Premium Plans 2020-2021 |
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In 2020-2021, pupil premium funding is, at present, set at £1345 per pupil. The allocation for the school is forecast at £7920.

How we will use our Pupil Premium spending

- Funding of a Learning Support Assistant for 7.25 hours a week for one to one and group support.
- Funding of a Teaching Assistant who will work one to one/small group with children for 2 hours per week.
- Financial support for trips/residentials – if Government Guidance allows
- Provision of free school meals
- SEN assessments
- Resources to support the children’s learning e.g. Nessler, cursive font
- Training/CPD for staff
- Additional “catch up” provision due to Covid-19
- Resources to support the children’s socially, emotional and medical needs.
